1. Introduction

2. Product Overview

E10W / E10B

E10 is a wired temperature thermostat with a WiFi and Bluetooth module. It enables economic and ecological control of any type of heating. Provides remote control of the heating system using the ENGO Smart / Tuya Smart app. It is characterized by a clear menu and a multitude of useful functions. Programming the E10 is very simple and allows you to adjust the heating cycle to the user's daily rhythm. The model is available in white and black.

Using ENGO Smart, we can manage smart home devices working on the basis of various communication standards - Zigbee, Bluetooth or Wi-Fi. We can control the equipment from anywhere. We also have the option to control several devices at the same time.

A big plus is the ability to issue voice commands via Amazon Alexa and Google Assistant. We also have the ability to create rules based on, among others about time, location or current air temperature. There is also an option to assign access rights to specific people - for example family members. ENGO Smart is a free app, available for both Android and iOS users.



2.2 Proper thermostat location






The recommended height for mounting the E10W / E10B thermostat is approx. 1.5 m above the ground, away from any sources of heat or cool. It is not recommended to install the thermostat on an outside wall, in a draft or in a place where it will be exposed to direct sunlight.


2.3 Wall mounting

To properly mount the thermostat on the wall, please follow the steps below:




Use a screwdriver to unscrew the screw at the bottom of the thermostat to detach the rear part.

Make sure that the wires are not under 230V AC.



Connect the thermostat according to the wiring diagram.

Put the thermostat in the box.



Screw the thermostat to the mounting box.


Slide the front of the thermostat onto its back and tighten the screw from the bottom.

Turn on the power.

The thermostat is now ready for operation.







4.1 Wi-Fi installation guidelines

- Make sure that the Wi-Fi network where you want to install the app broadcasts in the 2.4 GHz frequency.
- We recommend turning off mobile internet (cellular data) on your phone during configuration.
- It is recommended to use the encryption of the Wi-Fi network at the WPA-Personal level.

4.3 About ENGO Smart app (general information)

The heart of the ENGO system is its ENGO Smart app. It allows you to combine the functionality of many devices in an accessible way. It allows you to connect to devices marked with the logs "Powered by Tuya" or "Powered by Tuya" Intelligence Inside".

Remote control is carried out via the Tuya cloud, which connects to the user's phone, so that the user of the device does not have to rent a server room or write software for it. Why can't the phone connect directly to the device? Such a necessity is due to the fact that it would require an appropriate router with a fixed IP address, so the cellular network will not work, and even with such a router, its configuration would be quite complicated and would require some sacrifices as regards the security of the link, because you would have to allow the devices from outside the house connected to it.

The first connection and configuration can be performed manually according to the instructions displayed in the app, but there is also an option to automatically scan for configurable devices. After that, the device automatically connects with the app and is visible on the list.

Each of the owned devices can be optionally assigned to the room in which it is located, which makes it easier to find out when our home is truly intelligent. All devices, regardless of whether they belong to specific rooms, are assigned to one of the houses that can have more than one. This assignment is not pointless, as the app knows where the device is located and can provide information about the current weather.

Thanks to this data, you can create so-called scenes, i.e. automate repetitive activities and thus save time. For example, you can set in the app that if the temperature drops below fifteen degrees, the heating will turn on or that the light will come on when the sun goes down.

But what if you need to automate something independent of the weather? The ENGO app also satisfy such a need, and it does so by using scenes that can be run with a single tap, or scenes that trigger when the state of one of the added devices changes. Example: we are leaving the house and we want the power to be cut off from the smart socket to which the iron is connected, and five minutes after that, all lights in the house turn off. It can be easily configured and started with one tap. It is similarly simple to solve the problem of turning off the light in the bedroom - if the bedside lamp is turned on, it can be set to turn off the light in the bedroom.


Finally, it is worth noting that a lot of Tuya products (compatible with the ENGO app) support Google Assistant and Amazon Alexa voice control, which can be recognized by the inscriptions on the label saying "works with Google Home" and "works with Amazon Alexa", respectively. If "Intelligence Inside" is added to the text "Powered by Tuya" to create "Powered by Tuya: Intelligence Inside", the product with this text supports Samsung's SmartThings technology.


5. First power on

The thermostat is powered by 230V. When properly connected to the power supply, the thermostat will start up showing all the icons and then go to the main screen.





Method 1: Scan the QR code with the device's scanner, download and install the app.

Method 2: Open the Google Play Store on your smartphone, search for and install the "ENGO Smart" app.

2. FOR MOBILE DEVICE WITH IOS SYSTEM:

Method 1: Scan the QR code and follow the directions to get to the AppStore, download and install the app.

Method 2: Open Apple's "AppStore" on iPhone, search for "ENGO Smart" app, download and install.

Please note! Make sure your router is within range of your mobile phone. Make sure you are connected to the Internet. This will reduce the pairing time of the device.









Make sure the thermostat is powered on. Then press and hold the buttons on the thermostat for approx. 3 sec. until the display shows "PA". Then release the keys. The pairing mode will be started up.



In the app, select: "Add Device".




Then choose: "Auto Scan".

Select the Wi-Fi network in which the thermostat will operate and enter the password of this network.

Wait for the app to configure the thermostat with the selected Wi-Fi network.

The thermostat has been installed and displays the main interface.


8. Operation in the app

8.1 General information

In this chapter, you can learn how to use the Wi-Fi thermostat in connection with the ENGO Smart app. To be able to control the thermostat via the Internet, you will need an Internet connection and the ENGO Smart app. Controlling the thermostat via the app from a mobile device (IOS, Android) gives you a lot of freedom and the ability to remotely manage the temperature from anywhere.


View of the E10 thermostat menu in the ENGO Smart app:



8.3 Control

8.3.1 Setpoint temperature change

Changing the temperature setpoint is done by moving the cursor left / right in the app. On the screen, the actual temperature setpoint is represented by the number displayed in larger font.



Enter the thermostat interface.

Make a new temperature setting by moving the slider along the bar.


The thermostat started sending a signal for heating, which was signaled by a change of working status to "Heating"...



...and the heating icon appears on the display of the thermostat.

8.3.2 "Power" function

In this option, the user can turn ON / OFF the thermostat from the app without the need to interfere with the power wire. To do so, please follow the steps below:



Enter the thermostat interface.

Select the "Control" option.

You can turn the thermostat on / off by using "Power" slider.




When the "Power" slider is grayed out, then the thermostat is off...

8.3.3 Manual mode

In the manual mode, the thermostat will maintain the temperature setpoint until the user changes it again via the app or thermostat, or selects a new operating mode in the app. To set the manual mode, follow the steps below:




8.3.4 Schedule mode

The E10 thermostat allows you to set schedules. When creating a schedule, the time of its commencement along with the set temperature is given. A maximum of 6 switching points can be set for each day of the week.

To activate the schedule, press the schedule icon in the "Work modes" place. Once activated, the status of the thermostat will update to "Schedule".

To activate the schedule mode:



COPYING DAYS



Then select the days for which you want to duplicate the settings.



8.3.5 Holiday mode

In the holiday mode, you can program the temperature that will be maintained for a selected number of days (e.g. during a home absence).







8.3.6 FROST mode

In the FROST mode, the preset temperature in the thermostat is kept as a constant value of 5°C. When the anti-freeze (FROST) mode is active, a snowflake icon is displayed on the thermostat. When the ambient temperature drops below 5°C, the thermostat will start sending the heating signal. This moment will be signaled by the app by changing the status to "Heating on - FROST mode", and the snowflake icon will start blinking on the thermostat. Changing the set temperature during the active FROST mode (from the app or thermostat level) will change the status to manual mode.








8.3.7 Diagrams

The ENGO Smart app offers room temperature history graphs and the heating time coefficient for the selected day. They allow you to better plan the operation of the thermostat, e.g. using the schedule mode based on the recorded data, which will make the operation even more economical.



Enter the thermostat interface.


The heating time factor will show the percentage and the hour after hovering over the selected section.

8.4 Settings (installer parameters)

8.4.1 Child lock function

The app allows you to lock the buttons on the device. Just change the position of the slider on the screen. When the dot is green and on the right, then thermostat keys are locked. To unlock, press the slider again so that it is unlit and to the left. Then the buttons on the thermostat are unlocked.



Enter the thermostat interface.

Select "Settings".

Use the slider to lock / unlock the buttons on the thermostat.




When the slider is highlighted green, then thermostat buttons are blocked.

When the buttons are locked, only the currently measured temperature can be read on the thermostat.

8.4.2 Backlight brightness

The user can change the brightness of the thermostat display. Move the slider to the appropriate direction as in the steps below:

Select "Settings".



8.4.3 Max temp. limit

This parameter allows you to set the maximum temperature setpoint in the thermostat. Take a look at the steps below:





8.4.5 Sensor Selection


8.4.5.1 Internal temperature sensor (IN)

By default, the thermostat measures the temperature with the thermostat's internal built-in temperature sensor.



PLEASE NOTE!

For the selected option with an internal sensor, if an additional floor sensor is connected to the terminals S1-S2 of the thermostat, both sensors are active (internal and external). The internal sensor measures and controls the temperature in the room, and the additional sensor acts as a floor protection against overheating and overcooling. The factory setting for overheat protection is 26°C, adjustable from 10°C to 45°C. When this value is exceeded, the thermostat will turn off the heating. When overheating occurs, the floor protection icon will flash on the thermostat's LCD display. The app also shows the message "Heating off - sensor overheating". After the floor sensor has cooled down, the heating restarts. The factory temperature setting for protection against floor overcooling is fixed at 5°C. After the temperature on the floor sensor drops below 5°C, the thermostat will automatically start heating. The Floor Protection icon will flash on the thermostat LCD. The app will display the message "Heating on - FROST mode".



Additionally, you can set the maximum set

temperature (from 10°C to 45°C) for the

floor sensor (if there is an underfloor heating system and the sensor is connected).



8.4.5.2 External temperature sensor (OUT)


If an external sensor is connected and selected, the thermostat will display the temperature from that sensor ignoring the internal sensor. An external temperature sensor can be used when the thermostat controls a room to which we have no access. Please note that if there is no external sensor connected, and the external sensor is selected in the settings, the thermostat display will not show temperature, but error E2 instead of.




Enter the thermostat interface.



Select "Settings".



Select the external (OUT) sensor.



Use the slider to set the EXT sensor deadzone value from \pm 0.1°C to \pm 0.5°C.

8.4.6 Temperature correction

This function allows you to adjust the room temperature by \pm 3.0°C in steps of 0.5°C. This is useful if the thermostat is in a location with a slightly different temperature than the general room temperature. Take a look at the steps below:



Select "Settings".


Use the slider to select the correction value for the current temperature.

8.4.7 Control type (algorithm)

HYSTERESIS ALGORITHM

Hysteresis algorithm uses a temperature difference (against setpoint temperature) to switch heating device ON and OFF. If thermostat works over hysteresis and it is used in a slow response system (e.g. underfloor heating), cycles of underheating and overheating cannot be avoided. It is difficult to maintain a constant temperature in the room because the thermostat is activated when the temperature drops below the setpoint temperature. In a system with high thermal inertia, the room temperature may still drop after the thermostat is turned on. Conversely, the thermostat switches off when the temperature is higher than the preset temperature. After the thermostat is turned off, the room temperature continues to rise because the heated concrete floor has to give off heat to the surroundings. The hysteresis value can be changed in steps of 0.1 from \pm 0.1°C to \pm 0.5°C - the lower the value, the thermostat will react faster to temperature changes in the room. For example, if you set the temperature to 20°C and if the hysteresis is 0.5°C, the heating will be turned on when the temperature drops to 19.5°C and turned off when the temperature reaches 20.5°C.

How to set the hysteresis in the ENGO Smart app for the Wi-Fi thermostat:



Enter the thermostat interface.

Select "Settings".

Select the "Hysteresis" option.

From this point on, the thermostat will start working according to the hysteresis set on the internal or external sensor.



TPI ALGORITHM

The TPI algorithm works differently compared to the hysteresis. It selects "a few or a dozen or so minute time pulses" for switching on and off the heating device in such a way as to maintain the room temperature closest to the set values. Even when the temperature has been reached, it heats up with impulses anyway to maintain comfort in the room.

TPI (Time Proporcional and Integral) is an algorithm with a simple memory in its software, thanks to which it "learns" how the temperatures in the room are achieved and maintained. It has the basic computing ability: it "works" with collected data and current temperatures, "predicting" how long heat must be supplied (heating must be on). This is a kind of "intelligent control" as the heat supply takes long enough to reach the set point and turns off, increasing energy efficiency. TPI works according to cycles, the length of which is measured in amounts per hour. During normal use, you can see that the thermostat works shorter as it approaches the set temperature. Once the set point is reached, the thermostat run times become short in order to maintain the temperature. In the E10 thermostat, you can select the TPI algorithm for a specific type of heating (floor, radiator or electric).

How to set the TPI algorithm in the ENGO Smart app for the Wi-Fi thermostat:





8.5.3 Tap-To-Run and Automation


The "Tap-To-Run" and "Automation" rules are a preconfigured set of actions defined by an easy-to-use interface. Besides the obvious tasks that can be programmed to keep the system running automatically. In addition, there are also functions that improve the visual effect and the convenience of use. There are 2 main rule programming interfaces in the app that can be used for task settings:


- Tap-To-Run with one touch, run several operations at the same time e.g. turn OFF all thermostats,
- Automation set up linked activities, where one device will affect another by defined actions.


An example of setting the "Tap-To-Run" rule with the use of three E10 thermostats, where these actions will be triggered:


- a) disconnecting the first thermostat from the power supply,

It is possible to delete a single task without deleting the entire rule. To do this, push, hold and slide the tile of the given task to the left. The "Delete" button will be displayed in red:




All rules related to the thermostat will be displayed. To activate one at this point, click on its tile.


The user can mute notifications about the thermostat at any time. See steps below:







8.5.5 Share device


The ENGO Smart app offers the possibility of sharing the selected device with other users (assigned to the home). This is a convenient option if you don't want to give your home full access. To do this, follow the steps below:

Select "Share Device".




Add sharing.

After the device is made available, the user can set a validity period for this sharing and can also terminate it at any time by selecting "Unshare".



8.5.6 Create group

Simultaneous control of few E10 thermostats will be available after creating a new group and assigning the selected thermostats to this group. Then, a virtual master thermostat appears on the desktop, which allows you to overwrite all parameters in the grouped thermostats.

For example: If you set the virtual thermostat to manual mode, then each thermostat in this group will switch to manual mode. See the steps below on how to group multiple thermostats.



Enter the thermostat interface.






The main group management interface will be displayed from where you can set temperature or change operation modes / settings.




Confirm it by "Go" button. After all, a shortcut to the thermostat will appear on the phone's desktop.

8.5.9 Check device network

Each wireless device has a limited range of data transmission. In addition to distance, range can be affected by many other external factors such as stone walls, interference from other wireless networks, reinforced concrete ceilings, metal structural elements, pillars, etc.


The ENGO Smart app has a built-in function that allows you to check the range and quality of wireless connection of the added devices. This is the case with the Wi-Fi thermostat. To check the connection quality, follow the steps below:



Enter the thermostat interface.

Click the pencil icon in the top right corner.

Select "Check Device Network".




The app will start testing the Wi-Fi connection with the thermostat...

8.5.10 Device update

It allows you to update the device software to the latest version. You can start the update manually or choose the automatic update option.




Press and hold the thermostat icon.

Click the pencil icon in the top right corner.


Select "Check for available software updates".

Confirm.



How to fix the problem?

The internet connection icon is not displayed on the thermostat.	The thermostat is not connected to the Internet. Check the connection between thermostat and Internet. In this case, it is possible to control the thermostat locally using a mobile device. The mobile device and the thermostat must be on the same Wi-Fi network.
The Wi-Fi connection icon is flashing on the thermostat.	 The Wi-Fi network in which the thermostat was installed is turned off. Check the router and Wi-Fi connection. In this case, it is possible to control the thermostat locally via Bluetooth. The mobile device must have access to the Internet (via Wi-Fi or mobile data) and be near the thermostat. The thermostat is in pairing mode. Reinstall the thermostat.
Thermostat displays error E2*.	Check or connect the external temperature sensor.
The thermostat has the display off.	Check if you connected the wires correctly or if the thermostat is not turned off in the app.



Enter the "Me" menu.

Select a message center.


Jump between the Alarm, Home and Bulletin tabs one by one to find a message or notification about your thermostat.

10. Remove device

To remove the E10 thermostat from your account, follow these steps:



Click and hold the thermostat icon.

Select the device and click "Remove device".

Then confirm.



Click "Done".

The device has been removed and will disappear from the main screen.

11. Cleaning and maintenance

The E10 thermostat does not require any special maintenance. Do not use brushes, washers or other tools that may scratch the surface of the thermostat for cleaning and maintenance of the surface, and do not use abrasive or foaming agents, as well as aggressive substances containing acids, chlorine or its compounds, solvents or bleaching agents, as this may damage the thermostat. Always clean the display and buttons with a damp, soft cloth. Plastic surfaces can also be cleaned with colorless, mild cleaning agents. Do not spray cleaner directly onto the device. After washing the surface, you can gently polish it with a soft, dry cloth. There are no user serviceable / replaceable parts inside. Service or repair may be performed only by an authorized ENGO Controls service.
